This established flight line is in accordance with established FAA rules and regulations concerning air shows. Unauthorized and unescorted individuals are not allowed beyond this established flight line, or other sensitive areas of the airport without prior permission from the Air Show President. I further understand that crossing the flight line may expose myself to serious personal injury which could even result in death, nevertheless, I wish to participate in the crossing of the flight line and seek consent to go beyond the flight line.

I understand that this right can and will be revoked at anytime if safety is a concern and the Quad City Air Show management reserves the right to modify or restrict access to anyone, at anytime, even if prior permission was granted.

In consideration of being allowed to go beyond the flight line as a performer, participant or volunteer at the 2008 Quad City Air Show, I hereby for myself, my heirs, my executors and administrators waive and release all rights and claims for damage that I may incur for being beyond the flight line or in the direct area of flight operations against the Air Show President, producer, directors, volunteers, sponsors, Aerial Promotions, Inc., City of Davenport, their directors, council, officers, commissioners, agents, employees, Hopper Corporation, Vertical Flight Helicopter Services, Inc. and KWH Productions, its directors, agents, employees and officers for any responsibility for any reason for injury or damage which may occur to my aircraft, equipment or person, for any reason whatsoever.

I have read the above document and have signed it voluntarily without any undue duress or force or coercion.
